A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 18° E., 62 lks. dist., with partially healed blaze.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 49° E., 69 lks. dist., with scribe marks S17 T30S R7W CS BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 37° W., 57 lks. dist., with scribe marks CS 18 BT visible on partially healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, pine, chinquapin, and live oak; undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, huckleberry, manzanita, poison oak, and fern.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in this resurvey are located in mountainous terrain about 7 miles southerly from the small town of Olalla, Oregon. The area drains northerly via Wildcat Creek into Olalla Creek and then into the South Umpqua River. The elevations range from about 1500 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 7, 8, 17, and 18, to about 3100 feet above sea level near the West 1/16 section corner of sections 19 and 30.

Access is by way of a paved road, branching off Highway No. 42 through Olalla, Oregon and by numerous other gravelled roads leading into the area.

Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, live oak, maple, alder, and chinquapin, with undergrowth of huckleberry, rhododendron, salal, fern manzanita, poison oak, and hazel.
