CHAINS

The history of surveys pertaining to this resurvey is as follows:

A portion of the west boundary was surveyed by William H. Byars, in 1881, as shown on the official plat of survey of T. 29 S., R. 3 W., approved August 11, 1881.

A portion of the west boundary was surveyed by William M. Bushey, in 1893-94, as shown on the official plat of survey of T. 30 S., R. 3 W., approved June 29, 1895.

A portion of the west boundary was resurveyed and the north boundary and a portion of the subdivisional lines was surveyed by Fred Mensch, in 1909, as shown on the official plat of survey approved October 14, 1910.

The north boundary was resurveyed by Elmer F. Strickler, in 1917, as shown on the official plat of survey of T. 29 S., R. 2 W., approved June 10, 1918.

A portion of the west boundary and subdivisional lines were resurveyed and section 7 was subdivided, by Harvey E. Wofford, in 1970, as shown on the official plat of survey accepted April 20, 1972.

Preliminary to the resurvey the lines of the original survey were retraced and search was made for all corners and other calls of the record. Identified corners were remonumented in their original positions, lost corners were re-established and remonumented at proportionate positions, based on the original record. The retracement data were thoroughly verified and only true line field notes are given herein. Only those lines bounding, or crossing, public lands were blazed. All lines not forming closures were chained twice.

The resurvey was executed in accordance with the specifications as set forth in the Manual of Surveying Instructions, 1947, and the Special Instructions dated June 29, 1971, under Group 749, Oregon.

The directions of lines were determined by deflection angles turned from azimuths obtained by direct solar observations.

The geographic position of the southeast corner of section 6, as scaled from the Tiller, Oregon, quadrangle map, prepared by the United States Geological Survey in 1944, is as follows:

Latitude $42^{\circ} 59.5' N.$ Longitude $122^{\circ} 58.8' W.$

The mean magnetic declination is $20^{\circ} E.$
