with no marks remaining. (Bushey record)

A root hole, bears S. 68° W., 36 lks. dist.,
with a down fir, 16 ins. diam., alongside,
with scribe marks T30S R3W visible on opened
blaze. (Mensch record)

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 77° E.,
51 lks. dist., with scribe marks S RW S6
CS visible on open double blaze.

A hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 79° W.,
21 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 39° W.,
27 lks. dist., marked T30S R3W S1 BT.

Corner falls at bottom of descent, slopes E.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, pine, madrone, hemlock, chinquapin, alder,
maple, and dogwood;

undergrowth, poison oak, manzanita, fern, blackberry, vine maple,
hazel, willow, Oregon grape, salal, huckleberry, arrowwood, and
wild rose.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 55 1/2° E.,
91 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Mensch
record)

A broken fir stump, 33 ins. diam., bears
S. 56° E., 45 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
(Bushey record) Bushey and Mensch both
report destroying marks on this tree.

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 52° W.,
37 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Bushey
record) Bushey and Mensch both report
