CHAINS

Access is gained by way of a paved highway, from the town of Tiller and by dirt roads branching from the highway. The land is mountainous with elevations ranging from about 1400 feet above sea level along Coffee Creek, to about 2255 feet above sea level near the south boundary of section 6.

The land is not well suited for farming, except in the bottom lands along Coffee Creek, and is chiefly valuable for its stands of timber. Soil consists of clay loam and rock. The timber consists of fir, pine, cedar, oak, maple, alder, madrone, dogwood, chinquapin, and yew. The undergrowth consists of hazel, arrowwood, vine maple, blackberry, Oregon grape, salal, willow, poison oak, ferns. and grasses.

There are numerous unpatented mining claims throughout the area. The general drainage is south.

The mean of a considerable number of readings taken over the entire area surveyed gives a value of 20° E. for the magnetic declination. There is a range of 2° in local attraction.
