CHAINS

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 30° E., 62 lks. dist., with scribe marks S16 visible on partially healed blaze.

A fir snag, 48 ins. diam., bears N. 50° W., 25 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and bearing trees marked by White, Corbin, and Beck

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 10° E., 50 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. 40° E., 36 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 40 1/4° W., 76 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 14 1/2° W., 55 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

S. 87° 19'W., bet. secs. 8 and 17.

Ascend 125 ft. over nearly level land, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

35.10 Big Dutchman Butte, bears N. 30° W. and S. 30° E; desc. 95 ft. over SW. slope.

39.53 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 8 and 17, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 22 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 59° E., 55 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S8 BT.

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 39° E., 54 lks. dist., mkd. 1/4 S17 BT.

Descend 595 ft. over SW. slope.

66.15 Ravine, drains. S. 30° W.; asc. 15 ft. over SE. slope.

71.80 Spur, slopes S. 45° W.; desc. 100 ft. over NW. slope.

79.06 The cor. of secs. 7, 8, 17, and 18, perpetuated and recorded by Lorne V. Swearingen, Registered Logging Engineer, No. 4186, in 1962, monumented with an iron rod, 1 in. diam., firmly set, protruding 5 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears S. 22° W., 33 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 16 ins. diam., with illegible scribe marks visible on bark blaze.

A root hole, bears N. 66° W., 21 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 38 ins. diam., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark blaze.
