A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N. 42 1/4° W., 191 lks.
dist., mkd. T24S R7W S36 CC BT.

From this point, the cor. of Tps. 24 and 25 S., R. 6 W., bears S. 0° 19' W., 0.17 chs. dist., described in the field notes of a dependent resurvey in T. 24 S., R. 6 W., under this Group.

From this same point, the original closing cor. of Tps. 24 and 25 S., R. 7 W., bears S. 89° 25' E., 3.65 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by the County Surveyor in 1963, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., protruding 6 ins. above the ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed fir stump, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 8° E., 53 lks. dist., with no marks visible.
(Record, S. 4° E., 45 lks.)

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 57° W., 67 lks. dist., with scribe marks CC 25S R7W S1 BT visible on bark. (Record, S. 59 1/2° W., 65 lks.)

A fir, 63 ins. diam., bears N. 52° W., 59 lks. dist., with no scribe marks visible on burned bark blaze. (Record, N. 49° W., 56 lks.)

and bearing trees mkd. by the County Surveyors Office in 1963

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 31 1/2° E., 151 lks. dist., with scribe marks CC T24S T25S R7W BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 30° W., 169 lks. dist., mkd. with a pitched over blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, yew, maple, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, young timber, fern, salal, Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, manzanita, ceanothus, vine maple, poison oak, blackberry, and salmonberry.
