Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 25 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

36.00 Rocky spur, slopes S. 30° E.; continue along S. slope at top of rock bluff.

39.97 The cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23, and 24, determined from the original 1856 Hathorn bearing trees:

A white oak, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 24° E., 251 lks. dist., with no scribe marks visible on opened and rotted blaze. (Record, N. 18° E., 285 lks.)

A root hole, bears S. 72½° E., 175 lks. dist., with a rotted oak, 24 ins. diam., alongside, with no marks visible. (Record, S. 70° E.)

A white oak, 29 ins. diam., bears N. 15 3/4° W., 275 lks. dist., with scribe marks S14 visible on opened blaze. (Record, N. 20° W.)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 15 ins. long, 1 in. diam., 8 ins. in drill hole in solid rock, with brass cap mkd.

A madrone, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 70 3/4° E., 151 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S13 BT.

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 77° E., 173 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S24 BT.

An oak, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 61° W., 318 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S23 BT.

A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 46° W., 328 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S14 BT.

The corner falls at the top of rock bluff, 200 ft. high, edge bears NW. and SE.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay with numerous rock outcroppings.

Timber, fir, oak, madrone, cedar, yew, maple, and alder; undergrowth, young timber, fern, salal, poisonoak, hazel, arrowwood, nive maple, manzanita, salmonberry, and blackberry.

From the cor. of secs. 1, 2, 11, and 12, monumented with an ironpost, 2½ ins. diam., protruding 6 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd. and witnessed as described in the official record of a 1958 resurvey.

N. 0° 05' E., bet. secs. 1 and 2.

Descend 530 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, along E. edge of logged area.

1.30 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 75° W. and S. 75° E.

16.80 Bottom of descent, slopes NW.; asc. 40 ft. along broken W. slope.

23.00 Top of ascent, slopes W.; desc. 80 ft. over NW. slope.
