Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, T. 25 S., R. 7 W.

CHAINS

A fir, 35 ins. diam., bears S. 65° E., 46 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S34 BT.

A fir, 29 ins. diam., bears N. 24° W., 80 lks. dist., mkd. T25S R7W S28 BT.

Land, mountainous, N. half, broken foothills, S. half. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, oak, cedar, maple, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, young timber, fern, salal, poison oak, hazel, arrowwood, vine maple, Oregon grape, and blackberry.

From the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of secs. 27 and 34, determined at record bearing and distance from the remaining original bearing tree:

A black oak, 40 ins. diam., bears N. 89° W., 693 lks. dist., with scribe marks $\frac{1}{4}$ visible on opened blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ ° E., 80 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S27 BT.

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 16° W., 100 lks. dist., mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S34 BT.

S. 89° 46' W., bet. secs. 27 and 34.

Ascend 160 ft. over E. slope changing to NE. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

5.00 Leave open pasture, edge bears N. and S.; enter heavy timber.

10.40 From this point the NW. cor. of Donation Land Claim No. 48, bears North, 4.35 chs. dist., perpetuated and recorded by Bruce Rogers, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1965, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., protruding 8 ins. above ground, firmly set, with brass cap mkd.
