CHAINS

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The line between sections 33 and 34, in township 27 south, range 4 west, is located about 9 miles southeast of Roseburg, Oregon. The area is drained by the South fork of Deer Creek. The elevations range from about 1,050 feet above sea level to about 1,900 feet above sea level. Access into the area is gained by a gravelled road following the sinuosities of South Fork of Deer Creek.

The soil consists of rocky clay loam and supports a luxuriant growth of timber, which consists chiefly of fir, oak, cedar, yew madrone, maple and alder. Undergrowth is chiefly salal, Oregon grape, fern, cascara, arrowwood, poison oak, vine maple, wild rose, and blackberry.

No mineral deposits were noted during the course of the resurvey.

A number of readings along the line of the resurvey gives a mean magnetic declination of 18° 45' E.
