

# County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Dependent Resurvey, Portion of Subdivisional Lines, 15030  
T. 21 S., R. 4 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

## CHAINS

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 45° W., 61 lks. dist., with scribe marks T21S R4W S6 DCS BT visible on open blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, vine maple, hazel, Oregon grape, fern, and blackberry.

## GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of township 21 south, range 4 west, pertaining to this resurvey, is located about 8 miles southwesterly of the town of Cottage Grove, Oregon. Access is gained via Interstate Route 5 and gravelled roads branching from it. The area is predominately mountainous and is drained by Pass Creek draining southwesterly, and Ward Creek, draining Southerly. Elevations range from about 700 feet above sea level near the southern boundary of section 17, to about 1300 feet near the northeast corner of section 8.

Soil in the area consists of rock and clay loam, which supports a luxuriant growth of timber consisting primarily of fir, hemlock, cedar, alder, madrone, maple, chinquapin, and yew. The undergrowth consists of fern, salal, hazel, vine maple, rhododendron, blackberry, and Oregon grape. No indication of minerals was noted in the area.

The average of a considerable number of readings in the area gives a value of 20 1/4° E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 2° in local attraction.
