A cedar, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 61° W., $24\ 1/2^\circ$ lks.
dist., mkd. T25S R8W S17 CC BT.

From this point, the original closing cor. of secs. 17
and 20, bears N. $89^\circ\ 41'$ E., 0.14 chs. dist., monumented
by person(s) unknown with an iron pipe, 1/2 in. diam.,
firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, from which
the remaining original bearing tree:

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 22° W., 13 lks.
dist., with healed blaze.

From this same point, the cor. of secs. 16 and 21 only,
bears N. $3^\circ\ 08'$ E., 3.16 chs. dist., hereinbefore de-
scribed.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, maple, alder, and
chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, Oregon
grape, hazel, vine maple, and fern.

The point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 20 only, is at
midpoint latitudinally on the E. bdy. of sec. 20.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

That portion of township 25 south, range 8 west,
described in this resurvey is located in Douglas County,
about 6 1/2 miles westerly of Sutherlin, Oregon. Access is
gained by way of Hubbard Creek Road from Sutherlin and
by various dirt and gravelled logging roads extending
from Hubbard Creek, Road. The area is drained predomi-
nately by Arrow Creek, flowing southerly, and Bottom
Creek, flowing westerly.

The elevation ranges from about 1,000 feet above
sea level, near the corner of section 4, 5, 32, and 33,
on the south boundary of the township, to about 2,700
feet above sea level, near the center of section 20.
The area is forested by scattering to dense stands of
fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, oak, alder, chinquapin, and
madrone. The undergrowth consists mainly of salal, vine
