dist., with healed double blaze.

A madrone, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 65 3/4° E., 56  
lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R8W S14 B  
visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 64 3/4° W., 111 lks.  
dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 70 1/4° W., 61 lks.  
dist., with healed double blaze.

N. 0° 08' W., bet. secs. 10 and 11, marking and blazing  
the true line.

Ascend 195 ft. over S. slope, through moderate timber and  
undergrowth.

0.45 Wire fence, bears N. and W.

9.75 Spur, slopes S. 20° E.; desc. 50 ft. over broken NE.  
slope.

20.10 Ravine, drains E.; enter open pasture, edge bears N.  
and W.; asc. 280 ft. over SW. slope.

40.04 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 10 and 11, perpetuated and re-  
corded by Harvey L. Eppstein, County Surveyor, in 1930,  
from original evidence no longer in existence, further
