A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 14 1/4° W., 53 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky loam.

Timber, fir, pine, cedar, maple, madrone, chinquapin, and alder; undergrowth, salal, rhododendron, hazel, arrowwood, Oregon grape, and fern.

N. 89° 26' W., on the N. bdy. of sec. 4.

Ascend 30 ft. over SE. slope, through moderate timber and light undergrowth.

6.50 Spur, slopes W.; desc. 10 ft. over W. slope.

8.05 True point for the closing cor. of secs. 33 and 34, T. 25 S., R. 2 W., hereinafter described.

Descend 565 ft. over W. slope.

39.21 The 1/4 sec. cor. of sec. 4 only, perpetuated and recorded by Vernon R. Tracy, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1967, monumented with an iron post, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, protruding 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
