**CHAINS**

A pine, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 74 1/4° E., 82 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

A pine, 15 ins. diam., bears N. 67 3/4° W., 43 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze,

N. 0° 12' E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 10 ft. over SE. slope.

1.05 Spur, slopes S. 65° E.; desc. 45 ft. over broken NE. slope.

3.90 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 80° E.; asc. 170 ft. over broken SW. slope.

12.55 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears S. 55° E., and S. 55° W.

17.05 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 82° E.; asc. 40 ft. over broken SE. slope.

19.84 A locally established point, of which I have no record, monumented with a mound of stone, 2 ft. base, 1 ft. high, from which unrecorded bearing trees:

A pine, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 3° E., 28 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

A pine, 19 ins. diam., bears N. 21° W., 76 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially open blaze.

Ascend 15 ft. over SE. slope.

23.75 Creek, 5 lks. wide, course S. 57° E.; asc. 40 ft. over broken SE. slope.

30.70 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 80° E.; asc. 105 ft. over broken SE. slope.

39.68 The cor. of secs. 19, 24, 25, and 30, perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Logging Engineer No. 2880, in 1951, and subsequently perpetuated by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 14 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
