GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the foregoing survey are located in the foothills of the coast range in Douglas County, about 5 miles west of Riddle, Oregon. Access into the area is gained by way of the Glenbrook Loop Road, from Riddle, and a number of dirt roads branching from it. The area is drained mainly by Salt Creek, and Doe Creek, which flow generally south, and several small tributaries. The elevations range about 1040 feet above sea level, near the corner of sections 25, 26, 35, and 36, to about 2430 feet above sea level, near the 1/4 section corner of sections 24 and 25. The area is forested with scattering to dense stands of pine, fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, alder, laurel, and chinquapin. The undergrowth consists chiefly of salal, hazel, poison oak, Oregon grape, rhododendron, and fern. There are few permanent residents settled in the lower elevations. The area is valuable mainly for timber, with some grazing along the more gentle slopes.

There was evidence of two small mining operations along the lines of the resurvey, one each near the south and east boundaries of section 25.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 44' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 16° in local attraction.
