T. 26 S., R. 7 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

visible on open blaze. This tree was rescribed by Shaner. (Record, 102 lks.)

A sawed fir stump, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 32° W., 83 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on burned blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 36 ins. diam., bears N, 33 1/2° W., 89 lks. dist., no marks visible. (Record, N. 40° W., 93 lks. )

A hemlock, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 55° E., 37 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks T27S R7W S6 BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 35° W., 173 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks T27S R8W S1 BT visible on open blaze.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 64° W., 84 lks. dist., with scribe marks T26S R8W S36 BT visible on open blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 22° E., 148 lks. dist., mkd. T26S R7W S31 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, and maple; undergrowth, salal, huckleberry, blackberry, poison oak, ceanothus, arrowwood, Oregon grape, and fern.

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From the cor. of secs. 5, 6, 31, and 32, on the N. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by Richard C. Grant, Registered Engineer No. 2807, in 1958, monumented with the remains of the cedar post, 4 ins. square, projecting 4 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears N. 78° E., 11 lks. dist.

A root hole, bears S. 35° E., 64 lks. dist.

and bearing trees mkd. by Grant

A fir, 26 ins. diam., bears N 2 1/2° E., 43 lks. dist., with scribe marks S32 T25S R7W BT visible on bark blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 30° E., 18 lks. dist., with healed blaze.
