67.15 Ridge, bears E. and W.; desc. 120 ft. over N. slope.

75.40 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course E.; asc. 85 ft. over S. slope.

80.30 The cor. of secs. 7, 12, 13, and 18, perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1960, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A sawed fir stump, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 68° E., 70 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A sawed fir stump, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 72° E., 73 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 51° W., 51 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 30° W., 29 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, clay loam.

Timber, cedar, fir, hemlock, oak, chinquapin, maple, and madrone; undergrowth, vine maple, hazel, huckleberry, rhododendron, poison oak, fern, blackberry, manzanita, arrowwood, and salal.
