CHAINS

A root hole, bears N. 3° W., 24 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 25 ins. diam., with scribe marks T24S R6W S3 CS BT visible on open blaze.

and new bearing trees

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N. 14 1/2° E., 237 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R6W S2 BT.

A fir, 28 ins. diam., bears N. 41 1/2° W., 132 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T24S R6 W S3 BT.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, oak, hemlock, cedar, chinquapin, maple, and madrone; undergrowth, huckleberry, hazel, arrowwood, poison oak, manzanita, blackberry, vine maple, fern, and salal.

From the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 11, perpetuated and recorded by Wilford Haines, RLS No. 239, in 1954, monumented with a wooden post, 3 ins. sq., firmly set, projecting 26 ins. above ground, mks. 1/4 S2 on N. face and 1/4 S11 on S. face, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 67 1/2° W., 26 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S visible on open blaze.

A root hole, bears N. 50 1/4° E., 43 lks. dist., with a down and decayed fir alongside, 24 ins. diam., no marks visible.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Haines

A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 42 1/2° E., 14 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

Reset wooden post alongside iron post.

S. 89° 34' W., bet. secs. 2 and 11.

Ascend 107 ft. over steep and broken NE. slope, through medium timber and dense undergrowth.

5.75 Spur, slopes S. 60° E.; asc. 275 ft. over SE. slope.

15.91 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 57° E. and S. 70° W.

24.45 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 57° E. and S. 75° W.

28.05 Draw, bears S. 74° E.; asc. 445 ft. over SE. slope.

38.49 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 8° W. and S. 5° E.
