GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the notes of the foregoing survey are located about 7 miles northwesterly from Sutherlin, Oregon. The area is drained by Norton Creek and a number of its tributaries. Elevations range from about 600 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 14, 15, 22, and 23, to about 1,600 feet above sea level near the corner of sections 2, 3, 10, and 11.

Access into the area is by way of a number of dirt and gravelled roads.

Soil in the area is composed of rocky clay loam, varying from a few inches to several feet in depth.

Timber consists of fir, cedar, oak, hemlock, maple, chinquapin, and madrone; undergrowth of rhododendron, fern, hazel, poison oak, huckleberry, blackberry, vine maple, manzanita, arrowwood, and salal.

The land is valuable mainly for its timber and grazing. There are a few permanent residents located in the southwest quarter of section 11. No mineral deposits were noted during the course of the survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 20° E., for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° in local attraction.
