CHAINS

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay loam.
Timber, fir, cedar, maple, hemlock, alder, chinquapin,
and madrone; undergrowth, arrowwood, ceanothus, hazel,
Oregon grape, salal, salmonberry, huckleberry, black-
berry, rhododendron, poison oak, and fern.

N. 89° 42' W., bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Descend 75 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth.

2.45 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 10° W.; asc. 30 ft. over
NE slope.

5.00 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 15 ft. over NW. slope.

8.25 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N. 10° E.; asc. 90 ft. over
NE. slope.

16.60 Top of ascent, slopes NW.; desc. 125 ft. over NW. slope.

23.80 Ravine, drains NW.; asc. 55 ft. over NE. slope.

33.95 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 110 ft. over NW. slope.

38.10 Spring seepage, 10 lks. wide, course N. 25° E.; asc. 25
ft. over NE. slope.

40.16 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, determined at record
bearing and distance from the remains of the original
bearing trees:

A double fir, 52 ins. diam., bears N. 42° E., 11
lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir snag, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 26° W., 52 lks.
dist., with scribe mark B visible on opened
blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 20 ins.
in the ground, with brass cap mkd.

0.15 Dry creek bed, 1 lk. wide, course N. 5° W.; asc. 50 ft.
over NE. slope.
