- 8.10 Spur, slopes N. 15° W.; desc. 50 ft. over broken NW. slope.
- 17.00 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.; asc. 115 ft. over NE. slope.
- 27.40 Spur, slopes N. 25° E.; desc. 5 ft. over NW. slope.
- 29.30 Ravine, Drains N. 30° E.; asc. 65 ft. over NE. slope.
- 33.60 Spur, slopes N. 40° E.; desc. 70 ft. over NW. slope.
- 37.20 Ravine, drains N. 5° E.; asc. 25 ft. over NE. slope.
- 40.44 The cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, remonumented by Vernon Tracy, Deputy Douglas County Surveyor, in 1965, with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

- A fir snag, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 59° E. / 27 lks. dist., with scribe marks S35 T20S R5W visible on open blaze. (Record, 25 lks.)
- A fir, 42 ins. diam., bears S. 15° E., 54 lks. dist., with scribe marks S2 T21S R5W visible on bark blaze.
- A cedar, 25 ins. diam., bears S. 30° W., 33 lks. dist., no marks visible on decayed face of open blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Tracy

- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 77° E., 32 lks. dist. with scribe marks T21S R5W S2 CS BT. visible on an open double blaze.
- A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 87° W., 36 lks. dist., with scribe marks S3 DCS BT visible on open double blaze.

and new bearing trees

- A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 50° E., 83 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T20S R5W S35 BT.
- A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 19° W., 62 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R5W S3 BT.
- A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 42° W., 53 lks. dist., mkd. T20S R5W S34 BT.

Add the marks, BLM 1968, to the brass cap.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, alder, maple, chinquapin, and madrone; undergrowth, hazel, salmonberry, salal, Oregon grape, arrowwood, huckleberry, rhododendron, blackberry, poison oak, and fern.
