dist., no marks visible on weathered face of blaze. (Record, 8 lks.) This tree was remarked by Godfrey, in 1962; scribe marks T20S R5W S31 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Godfrey

A hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 9° E., 30 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open double blaze.

A cedar, 45 ins. diam., bears S. 52° W., 133 lks. dist., with scribe marks T21S R5W S6 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

and a new bearing tree

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 82 1/2° E., 162 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S5 BT.

Add marks BLM 1967 to brass cpa.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, sandy clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, alder, maple, chinquapin, and madrone; undrgrowth, salal, Oregon grape, hazel, arrowwood, huckleberry, salmonberry, ceanothus, vine maple, blackberry, rhododendron, poison oak, and fern.

N. 89° 26' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Ascend 55 ft. over NE. slope, through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.

3.65 Spur, slopes N. 15° W.; desc. 135 ft. over W. slope.

7.00 Ravine, drains N. 45° W.; asc. 20 ft. over NE. slope.

8.20 Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 40 ft. over NW. slope.

9.30 Ravine, drains N. 35° E.; asc. 215 ft. over E. slope.

17.10 Spur, slopes N. 30° E.; desc. 40 ft. over NW. slope.

19.50 Ravine, drains N.; asc. 60 ft. over NE. slope.

23.90 Spur, slopes N. 50° W.; desc. 115 ft. over general W. slope.

29.05 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course N.; asc. 165 ft. over NE. slope.

36.75 Spur, slopes N. 25° W.; desc. 15 ft. over NW. slope.

39.84 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, reestablished and recorded by Wilford N. Haines, Registered Land Surveyor No. 239, in 1962. This point is accepted as the best available evidence of the original corner position and is monumented with a "T" shaped iron rod, 36 ins. long, 1 in. webs, firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, from which bearing trees mkd. by Haines:

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 21° W., 5 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 74 1/2° E. 42 lks
