Dependent Resurvey of the South Boundary,
T. 20 S., R. 4 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

A fir 12 ins. diam., bears S. 19 1/2° E., 28 lks. dist., mkd. T21S R4W S1 BT.

Deposit corner stone alongside iron post.

The corner is located adjacent to cor. of wire fences, extending S. and W.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, chinquapin, maple, alder, and yew; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, fern, vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, and Oregon Grape.

N. 89° 34' W., bet. secs. 2 and 35.

Descend 85 ft. over SW. slope, through moderate timber and undergrowth.

7.40 Boren Creek, 5 lks. wide, course SE.; asc. 300 ft. over E. Slope.

18.50 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course SE.; continue ascent over NE. slope.

19.80 From this point, a corner of wire fences bears North, 0.030 chs. dist., with fences extending E. and S.

21.60 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S. 25° E.; continue ascent over SE. slope.

40.00 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 2 and 35, perpetuated and recorded by Glen McChesney, for Weyerhaeuser Timber Co., in 1959, monumented with an iron pipe, 2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A sawed fir stump, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 29° E., 30 lks. dist., no marks visible.

and the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by C. M. Collier, County Surveyor, in 1900

A fir snag, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 17 1/2° W., 38 lks. dist., with scribe marks S 35 B visible on opened blaze.

and the remains of a bearing tree mkd. by McChesney

A root hole, bears S. 36° E. 60 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 12 ins. diam., no marks visible.

and bearing trees mkd. by V. R. Tracey, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1967

A fir, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 4° W., 45 1/2 lks. dist., with partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 53° W., 14 lks. dist., with partially healed double blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
