dist., with partially open blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 54° W., 43 1/2 lks.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, alder, yew,
and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, vine
maple, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, blackberry, and
fern.

- 20.65 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 120 ft. over W. slope.
- 25.15 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NW.; asc. 180 ft. over NE. slope.
- 34.90 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 50 ft. over NW. slope.
- 39.85 Point for the 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 5 and 32, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner.
