**CHAINS**

A fir, 25 ins. diam., bears N. 7° W., 30 lks. dist., with healed lower blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyor

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 45° W., 61 lks. dist., with scribe marks T21S R4W S6 DCS BT visible on open blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, blackberry, and fern.

S. 89° 44' W., bet. secs. 6 and 31.

Ascend 30 ft. along N. slope, through light timber and undergrowth.

1.60 Spur, slopes N.; desc. 80 ft. over NW. slope.

10.30 Pole fence, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.

10.40 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.; also asc. 135 ft. moer broken NE. slope, through scattered timber.

10.90 Wire fence, bears N. 60° E. and S. 60° W.

40.12 The 1/4 sec. cor. of secs. 6 and 31, perpetuated and recorded by the Douglas County Surveyor, in 1968, when evidence of the original corner was in existence, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 18° E., 20 1/2 lks. dist., with a nail with "W" embossed on the head, at base.

A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears S. 36° W., 79 lks. dist., with a nail with "W" embossed on the head, at base.

and bearing trees mkd. by the Douglas County Surveyor

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 54 1/2° E., 84 lks. dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S6 visible on open upper blaze and BT visible on open lower blaze.

A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 35° W., 24 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

The corner is adjacent to a corner of fences, extending E. and N.
