CHAINS

N. 89° 00' W., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 85 ft. along broken N. slope, through moderate timber and undergrowth.

0.65 Gravelled road, 20 lsk. wide, bears N. 60° W. and S. 60° E.

10.60 Spur, slopes NE.; desc. 140 ft. over NW. slope.

17.55 Dirt road, 15 lks. wide, bears N. 10° W. and S. 10° E.

25.90 Curtain and Lorane Road, gravelled, 40 lks. wide, bears N. 15° E. and S. 15° W.

41.68 The cor. of Tps. 20 and 21 S., Rs. 4 and 5 W., perpetuated and recorded by the Douglas County Surveyor, in 1965, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A decayed fir stump, size indeterminate, bears N. 50° W., 8 lks. dist., with scribe marks BT visible on opened decayed blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 85 1/2° E., 26 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 20 1/2° E., 35 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 44 1/2° W., 6 1/2 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 2° W., 10 1/2 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, maple, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, vine maple, arrowwood, hazel, Oregon grape, blackberry, and fern.
