CHAINS

Elevations range from about 400 feet above sea level near the 1/4 section corner of sections 34 and 35, to about 2,050 feet above sea level, between sections 32 and 33. The area is drained by a number of small streams flowing northwesterly into Hubbard Creek and northeasterly into Mill Creek and the Umpqua River.

Timber in the area consists primarily of fir, cedar, and hemlock, with stands of maple, madrone, chinquapin, and alder. Undergrowth is chiefly salal, vine maple, hazel, Oregon grape, poison oak, arrowwood, young timber, and fern.

Numberous dwellings and farms were noted in the valley land and along the main roads in section 34.

No evidence of mineral deposits was noted along the lines resurveyed.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 30' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1" in local attraction.
