CHAINS

A black oak, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 44° W., 183 1/2 lks. dist., with knife marks S12 BT visible on opened and decayed blaze.

A black oak, 23 ins. diam., bears N. 3 3/4° W., 149 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Markham

A black oak, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 82 1/2° E., 95 1/2 lks. dist., no marks visible on partially opened and decayed blaze.

A ponderosa pine, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 22 1/4° W., 19 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Marvin C. Ramsey, Registered Land Surveyor No. 404, in 1967

A ponderosa pine, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 44° E., 26 1/2 lks. dist., with pitched over blaze.

A ponderosa pine, 13 ins. diam., bears S. 37° W., 85 1/2 lks. dist., with pitched over blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, directly over the iron pipe, with bras cap mkd.

(Restoring the 1871 survey by William H. Byars and the 1897 retracement and survey by Winfield S. Chapman and Carl S. Nicklin)

From the SE. cor. of sec. 18 only, T. 32 S., R. 4 W., established by Byars in 1871 as common to secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20, changed by Chapman and Nicklin in 1897 to sec. 18 only, determined at record distance from the faces of the remaining original 1871 bearing trees:

A burned and decayed fir snag, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 44° E., 25 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks S 17 T32S R4W BT visible on partially opened double blaze. (Record, N. 40° E., 25 lks.)

A sawed fir stump, 29 ins. diam., bears S. 63 1/2° W., 10 1/2 lks. dist., no marks remaining. (Record, S. 55° W., 9 lks.)
