A cedar, 28 ins. diam., bears S. 84° E., 29 lks. dist., with scribe marks T26S R3W S27 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

A cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears S. 72° W., 16 lks. dist., with scribe marks T26S R3W S28 CS BT visible on partially healed double blaze.

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 66° W., 39 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

Corner is located in barbed wire fence, extending N. 5° W. and S. 5° E.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, maple, madrone, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, Oregon grape, hazel, salal, and fern.
