CHAINS

and bearing trees mkd. by Byron

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 3° E., 27 1/2 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 87 3/4° E., 53 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 56 3/4° W., 65 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 38 1/2° W., 20 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, maple, myrtle, oak, cedar, madrone, chinquapin, and alder; undergrowth, salal, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, rhododendron, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14, and 15, perpetuated and recorded by F. C. Frear, County Surveyor, in 1936, subsequently perpetuated and recorded by A. R. Evans, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1949, and by James W. Byron, County Surveyor, in 1969, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:

A root hole, bears S. 62 1/4° E., 104 lks. dist., (Record, S. 64° E.)

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Frear

A madrone, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 24 3/4° E., 45 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R7W S11 CS BT visible on open double blaze. (This tree was rescribed by Byron)

A root hole, bears S. 2 3/4° W., 127 lks. dist.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Evans

A white oak, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 51 1/4° E., 317 1/2 lks. dist., with scribe marks R7W RE 277 visible on partially open double blaze.

and bearing trees mkd. by Byron

A cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears S. 28 1/2° E., 155 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R7W S15 CS BT visible on open blaze. (Should be S14)

A cedar, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 5 1/4° W., 157 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R7W S14 CS BT visible on open blaze. (Should be S15)

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.
