An alder snag, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 10° W., 17
lks. dist., no marks visible.

and bearing trees mkd. in 1957

A root hole, bears N. 49° E., 27 lks. dist., with
a down alder alongside, 22 ins. diam., with scribe
marks T19S R9W S26 BT visible on bark.

A cedar, 50 ins. diam., bears S. 19 1/2° W., 123 lks.
dist., with scribe marks T19S R9W S34 BT visible
on partially healed blaze.

An alder, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 71 3/4° W., 68 1/2 lks.
dist., with scribe marks T19S R9W S27 BT visible
on bark.

and a new bearing tree

A cedar, 74 ins. diam., bears N. 43 1/2° E., 112 lks.
dist., mkd. T19S R9W S26 BT.

N. 3° 31' W., bet. secs. 26 and 27.

Descend 10 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and
dense undergrowth.
