GENERAL DESCRIPTION	
<p>The lands included in the notes of the foregoing survey are located about 5 miles northeast of the community of Azalea, Oregon. The area is drained by Cow Creek and a number of its tributaries. Elevations range from about 1,700 feet above sea level along the bottom lands of Cow Creek, to about 3,105 feet above sea level near the south 1/16 section corner of sections 32 and 33.</p>	
<p>Access into the area is by way of Cow Creek Road, a paved county road, and several dirt roads branching from it.</p>	
<p>Soil in the area is composed of rocky clay with sandy loam in the bottom lands.</p>	
<p>Timber consists of fir, pine, cedar, hemlock, yew, madrone, oak, alder, maple, chinquapin, and dogwood; with undergrowth of Oregon grape, poison oak, salal, vine maple, huckleberry, manzanita, ceanothus, arrowwood, fern willow, and rhododendron.</p>	
<p>The area is valuable mainly for its timber, with some grazing along the bottom lands. There are a number of residents in the bottom lands along Cow Creek. No mineral deposits were noted during the course of the survey.</p>	
<p>The average of considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° 30' in local attraction.</p>
