

Dependent Resurvey of a Portion of the South Boundary, **15516**  
T. 29 S., R. 5 W., Willamette Meridian, Oregon

CHAINS

1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE T29S R5W W 1/16 S35 T30S 1969, from which bearing trees mkd. by Byron:

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N. 35° E., 48½ lks. dist., with scribe marks W 1/16 S35 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

A madrone, 11 ins. diam., bears N. ½° W., 101 lks. dist., with scribe marks W 1/16 S35 CS BT visible on open double blaze.

25.15 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N. 25° E.; asc. 185 ft. over SE. slope.

33.76 True point for the closing cor. of secs. 2 and 3, T. 30 S., R. 5 W., hereinafter described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the subdivisional lines of T. 30 S., R. 5 W.

Ascend 165 ft. over SE. slope, changing to NE. slope.

39.34 The cor. of secs. 34 and 35 only, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 4 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A madrone, 24 ins. diam., bears N. 45° E., 170 lks. dist., no marks visible on decayed blaze.

and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Zirpel

A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 22° E., 22 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A root hole, bears N. 74½° W., 35½ lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 14 ins. diam., with healed blaze.

from which a new bearing tree

A cedar, 11 ins. diam., bears N. 2° W., 33 lks. dist., mkd. T29S R5W S34 BT.

From this point, a local corner, established by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 2880, in 1951, bears N. 45° E., 0.22 chs. dist., monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 12 ins. above ground, from which the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Markham:

A root hole, bears N. 50° E., 39 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 12 ins. diam., with illegible scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.

A madrone, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 9½° W., 38 lks. dist., with scribe marks S34 T29S R5W BT visible on bark.
