	<p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, oak, cedar, madrone, maple, dogwood, yew, and cascara; undergrowth, fern, salal, poison oak, vine maple, Oregon grape, blackberry, thimbleberry, hazel, and reproduction.</p>
	<p>N. 89° 13' W., along the S. bdy. of sec. 34.</p> <p>Ascend 415 ft. over NE. slope, through medium timber and moderate undergrowth.</p>
8.45	Slope changes to SE. slope.
15.20	Ridge, bears NE. and SW.; desc. 230 ft. over NW. slope.
33.20	Ravine, drains N.; asc. slightly over NE. slope.
33.38	<p>Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 3 only, T. 30 S., R. 5 W., hereinafter described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the subdivisional lines of T. 30 S., R. 5 W.</p> <p>Ascend 205 ft. over NE. slope.</p>
39.45	<p>Point for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. of sec. 34 only, at proportionate distance; there is no remaining evidence of the original corner. No permanent monument established.</p> <p>Ascend 25 ft. over NE. slope.</p>
41.40	Spur ridge, slopes N.; desc. 540 ft. over NW. slope.
63.30	Creek, 3 lks. wide, course N. 15° W.; asc. 330 ft. over NE. slope.
72.34	<p>True point for the closing cor. of secs. 3 and 4, T. 30 S., R. 5 W., hereinafter described in the field notes of the dependent resurvey of the subdivisional lines of T. 30 S., R. 5 W.</p> <p>Ascend 85 ft. over NE. slope.</p>
78.90	<p>The cor. of secs. 33 and 34 only, perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 2880, in 1951, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p> <p>A root hole, bears N. 45° E., 22 lks. dist., with pieces of an oak tree alongside, size indeterminate, with scribe mark T visible on piece of blaze.</p> <p>A black oak, 19 ins. diam., bears S. 55° W., 9 lks. dist., with scribe marks S4 BT visible on bark. This tree was rescribed by Markham. (Record, 72 lks.)</p> <p>and the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Markham</p> <p>A fir, 17 ins. diam., bears N. 11° E., 23 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.</p> <p>A root hole, bears N. 53° E., 23 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 8 ins. diam., with healed double blaze.</p>
