CHAINS

Access into the area is mainly by way of asphalt surfaced Gazley Road, extending along the right bank of the South Umpqua River, and several dirt and gravelled roads branching from it. The area is drained by the South Umpqua River, and many of its tributaries.

Timber in the area consists primarily of fir, cedar, pine, oak, madrone, and chinquapin. Undergrowth is mainly poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, salal, blackberry, and fern.

The area is valuable mainly for timber resources and grazing. Some agricultural lands are located in the bottom land along the river.

No mineral deposits were noted along the lines re-surveyed and no mining activity was being carried on.

An average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 33' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 2° in local attraction.
