A cedar, 39 ins. diam., bears S. 1° E., 24 lks. dist., with scribe marks 4 S visible on open blaze.

A fir root crown, bears S. 60° W., 19 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 26 ins. diam., with scribe marks BT visible on open blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by Johnstone

A white fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 48° W., 16 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, myrtle, oak, alder, and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, vine maple, rhododendron, Oregon grape, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 4, 5, 32, and 33, on the S. bdy. of the Tp., perpetuated and recorded by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1957, monumented with an iron post, 1½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A fir snag, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 42° W., 27 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on open blaze. (Record, S. 40° W., 25 lks., to face)

A fir, 50 ins. diam., bears N. 8° E., 21 lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R8W S33 CS BT visible on bark blaze.

A cedar, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 10° E., 26½ lks. dist., with scribe marks T29S R8W S4 CS BT visible on open blaze.

A white fir, 5 ins. diam., bears S. 11½° W., 55 lks. dist., mkd. T29S R8W S5 BT.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 74¾° W., 248 lks. dist., mkd. T28S R8W S32 BT.
