A sawed fir stump, 38 ins. diam., bears S. 38° E.,  
56 lks. dist., with healed lower blaze, and a  
down log alongside, with fragmentary scribe  
marks visible on bark blaze.

A fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 61½° W.,  
19 lks. dist., with healed lower blaze, and  
fragmentary scribe marks visible on bark  
blaze. (Record, S. 65° W.)

A sawed fir stump, 38 ins. diam., bears N. 19¾° W.,  
32 lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks  
visible on bark blaze. (Record, N. 18° W.,  
30 lks.)

A white fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N. 72½° E., 8  
lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 13 ins. diam., bears N. 87½° E., 60 lks.  
dist., with scribe marks T28S R8W S33 CS BT  
visible on open blaze.

A white fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 20° W., 30  
lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A white fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 37½° W., 67  
lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A white fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 33¾° E., 58  
lks. dist., mkd. T28S R8W S33 BT.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple, myrtle, oak, alder,  
and chinquapin; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, Oregon  
grape, vine maple, rhododendron, and fern.

N. 89° 47' W., bet. secs. 28 and 33.

Ascend 70 ft. over NE. slope, through heavy timber and  
dense undergrowth.

- 5.45 Top of ascent, slopes SE.; desc. 5 ft. over NW. slope.
- 5.95 Ravine, drains S. 55° E.; asc. 455 ft. over NE. slope.
- 19.10 Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. and S. 5° W., in curve.
- 25.25 Ridge, bears N. 30° E. and S. 50° W.; desc. 170 ft. over  
general W. slope.
- 37.35 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course S.; asc. 95 ft. over SE. slope.
