A fir, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 73° E., 24 lks.  
dist., with scribe marks T28S R8W S21 B visible  
on open blaze.

A white fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 53½° W., 61  
lks. dist., with scribe marks T28S R8W S17 BT  
visible on open blaze. (Record, N. 50° W.)
