GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The lands included in the notes of the foregoing survey are located about 13 miles east of Myrtle Creek, Oregon. The area is drained by South Myrtle Creek, and a number of its tributaries. Elevations range from about 1,120 feet above sea level in the bottom lands along South Myrtle Creek, to about 2,000 feet above sea level near the $\frac{1}{4}$ section corner of sections 15 and 22.

Access into the area is by way of County Road Number 18. There are a few dirt roads throughout the area.

Soil in the area is composed of rocky clay. Timber consists of fir, cedar, pine, madrone, alder, maple, and dogwood; with undergrowth of Oregon grape, salal, poison oak, vine maple, hazel, arrowwood, rhododendron, and huckleberry.

The area is valuable mainly for its timber, with some grazing along the more gentle slopes and along South Myrtle Creek. There are a few dwellings along the bottom lands of South Myrtle Creek. No mineral deposits were noted during the course of the survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 20° E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° 30' in local attraction.
