73.00 Spur, slopes S. 65° W.; desc. 30 ft. over NW. slope.

74.60 Ravine, drains S. 80° W.; asc. 20 over SW. slope.

A burned fir stump, 18 ins. diam., bears S. 60° E., 17 lks. dist., with scribe marks R T31S S BT visible, in negative, on overgrowth lying on ground.

A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S. 18° E., 28 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A live oak, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 29° W., 48 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 21 ins. diam., bears N. 7° W., 43 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, maple, oak, and dogwood; undergrowth, vine maple, Oregon grape, hazel, salal, fern, rhododendron, and poison oak.
