CHAINS

Timber in the area is primarily fir, cedar, hemlock, madrone, and maple, with stands of alder in the creek bottoms and along the river. Undergrowth consists chiefly of salal, poison oak, Oregon grape, arrowwood, vine maple, and fern.

The land in the area is used primarily for timber resources and recreation.

A few permanent residences are located on the north side of the river. No mineral deposits were noted along the lines surveyed or resurveyed.

The average of a number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° 45' E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of up to 1° in local attraction.
