	<p>and bearing trees mkd. by the County Surveyor</p> <p>A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 2° E., 34 lks. dist., with healed blaze.</p> <p>A fir, 15 ins. diam., bears S. 60½° W., 33½ lks. dist., with healed blaze.</p> <p>Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky clay. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, maple, alder, myrtle, chinquapin, and madrone; undergrowth, salal, poison oak, hazel, vine maple, Oregon grape, and fern.</p>
	<p>From the ¼ sec. cor. of secs. 17 and 18, perpetuated by Ben Irving, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1927, from original evidence no longer in existence, subsequently perpetuated by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, monumented with an iron rod, ¼ in. diam., with top 12 ins. below surface of ground.</p> <p>At the corner point</p> <p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 52 ins. in the ground, directly over iron rod, with top 24 ins. below surface, with brass cap mkd.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">T 29 S R 8 W ¼ S 18 S 17 1973</p> <p>No suitable trees available within limits.</p> <p>Corner is located in large open field.</p> <p>From this corner, a point established by Byron for a witness corner, bears N. 89° 00' E., 3.970 chs. dist., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd. COUNTY SURVEYORS OFFICE T29S R8W WC 262 Feet West to ¼ S17 S18 1962, from which bearing trees mkd. by Byron:</p> <p>A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 2° E., 51½ lks. dist., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed double blaze.</p> <p>A fir snag, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 69½° E., 3½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S17 CS visible on partially healed double blaze.</p> <p>N. 0° 35' W., bet. secs. 17 and 18.</p> <p>Ascend 5 ft. across open field.</p>
19.10	Leave open field, edge bears E. and W., enter scattered timber and dense undergrowth; desc. 20 ft. over NW. slope.
19.35	Middle Fork Coquille River, 25 lks. wide, course S. 25° W.; asc. 60 ft. along river bottom.
27.50	Middle Fork Coquille River, 25 lks. wide, course S. 48° E.; continue along river bottom.
29.50	Middle Fork Coquille River, 25 lks. wide, course S. 55° W.; continue along river bottom.
