T29S R8W S18 BT.</p> <p>From this point, a local corner established by Byron, bears S. 73° 29' E., 0.28 chs. dist., monumented with an iron pipe, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
