	<p>From this point, a corner established by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1962, bears S. <math>72\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}</math> E., 0.14 chs. dist., monumented with an iron pipe, <math>\frac{3}{4}</math> in. diam., firmly set flush with the surface of the road.</p>
	<p>Ascend 40 ft. over E. slope, across open pasture land.</p>
64.00	<p>Top of ascent, slopes N.; desc. 55 ft. over NW. slope, also leave pasture, enter scattered timber and dense undergrowth, edge bears generally N. and S.</p>

	<p style="padding-left: 40px;">A white fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S. <math>42^{\circ}</math> W., 62<math>\frac{1}{2}</math> lks. dist., with healed double blaze.</p>
	<p style="padding-left: 40px;">A root hole, bears N. <math>34^{\circ}</math> W., 5<math>\frac{1}{2}</math> lks. dist., with a down hemlock alongside, 7 ins. diam., with fragmentary scribe marks visible on partially healed blaze.</p>

	<p>Land, rolling open pasture land. Soil, rocky clay loam and sandy loam in the lower areas. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, oak, alder, maple, madrone, pine, and yew; undergrowth, vine maple, poison oak, salal, hazel, ocean spray, blackberry, and huckleberry.</p>

	<p>N. <math>0^{\circ}</math> 28' E., bet. secs. 7 and 8.</p>
	<p>Descend 10 ft. through scattered timber and dense undergrowth.</p>
