CHAINS

Timber in the area consists of fir, hemlock, cedar, madrone, maple, oak, chinquapin, yew, pine, alder, and myrtle; with undergrowth of Oregon grape, salal, poison oak, vine maple, hazel, rhododendron, arrowwood, huckleberry, and fern.

The area is valuable mainly for its timber, with some pasture lands along the river and creek bottoms. There are resident dwellings in sections 7 and 13. No mineral activity or deposits were noted in the area covered by this survey.

The average of a considerable number of readings throughout the area gives a value of 19° E. for the mean magnetic declination. There is a range of 1° in local attraction.
