CHAINS	(Restoring the survey by Elliott N. Bowman and Josiah A. Burnett, Deputy Surveyors, in 1855-56, and correcting the 1955 resurvey by Hans W. Thielsen, Cadastral Surveyor)
	<p>From the SW. cor. of Donation Land Claim No. 40, monumented with a squared wooden post, 4 x 4 ins., firmly set, protruding 4 ft. above ground, and at the cor. of fences extending N., E., and W. This position has long been recognized by adjacent land owners, and is accepted as the best existing evidence of the original corner.</p> <p>N. 89° 17' E., along the S. bdy. of Donation Land Claim No. 40.</p> <p>Descend 25 ft. over nearly level ground, across open field.</p>
7.90	Olalla Creek, 4 chs. wide, course N. 20° E.; asc. 95 ft. over NW. slope.
20.00	Enter heavy timber and dense undergrowth, edge bears N. and S.
20.15	Spur, slopes N.; desc. 30 ft. over NE. slope.
21.25	Ravine, drains N.; asc. 30 ft. over NW. slope.
23.65	Spur, slopes N.; desc. 5 ft. over NE. slope.
25.63	The closing cor. of secs. 8 and 9, hereinbefore described. Descend 50 ft. over NE. slope.
28.70	Ravine, drains N. 15° W.; asc. 175 ft. over broken NW. slope.
44.27	Point for the closing cor. at intersection with the N. and S. center line of the NW¼ of sec. 9, hereinafter described. Ascend 90 ft. over NW. slope.
48.04	The SE. cor. of Donation Land Claim No. 40, perpetuated by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1954, subsequently perpetuated by John Powell, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1970, monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, protruding 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
