CHAINS

A white fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 81° E., 44½ lks. dist., with scribe marks CS visible on partially healed double blaze.

A sugar pine, 23 ins. diam., bears S. 50° W., 20½ lks. dist., with healed double blaze.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 78° W., 12½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S17 CS BT visible on open blaze.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay loam.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, pine, madrone, maple, and alder; undergrowth, salal, Oregon grape, poison oak, arrowwood, hazel, and fern.

From the cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32, and 33, monumented with an iron post, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 10 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

A chinquapin snag, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 51½° W., 31 lks. dist., no marks visible on opened and decayed blaze. (Record, N. 50° W.)

A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 3½° E., 68 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears S. 68° E., 40 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 32½° W., 44 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A fir, 9 ins. diam., bears N. 35° W., 12 lks. dist., with healed blaze. (Record, N. 32½° W.)

S. 87° 18' W., bet. secs. 29 and 32.

Descend 10 ft. over NW. slope, through heavy timber and moderate undergrowth.

0.50 Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N. 5° W.; desc. 90 ft. over NW. slope.

16.80 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course N. 20° W.; asc. 40 ft. along N. slope.

26.55 Top of ascent, slopes N. 20° W.; desc. 185 ft. over NW. slope.

35.30 Boulder Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 20° E.; asc. 180 ft. over E. slope.
