CHAINS

A pine, 7 ins. diam., bears S. $50\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 40 lks. dist., no marks visible on partially healed double blaze.

N. $1^{\circ} 28'$ E., beginning new measurement.

Ascend 3 ft. over SE. slope.

0.60 Top of ascent, slopes E.; desc. 50 ft. over NE. slope.

4.40 Ravine, drains S. 80° E.; asc. 45 ft. over S. slope.

6.19 The cor. of secs. 13 and 24 only, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, $2\frac{1}{2}$ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock, oak, madrone, alder, dogwood, yew, maple, and cascara; undergrowth, salal, hazel, vine maple, poison oak, Oregon grape, arrowwood, and fern.
