True point for the N 1/16 sec. cor. of secs. 25 and 26, falls in a sawdust pile where it is impracticable to establish a permanent monument.

Descend 20 ft. over NW. slope.

20.43

Wood Creek, 3 lks. wide, course SW.; asc. 190 ft. over SE. slope.

21.95

Dirt road, 10 lks. wide, bears NE. and SW.

36.64

The cor. of secs. 23, 24, 25, and 26, reestablished by proportionate measurement by M. B. Germond and F. C. Frear, Deputy County Surveyors, in 1918, monumented with an iron pipe, 1 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 2 ins. above ground. There is no remaining evidence of the original corner; therefore, this position is accepted as the corner, from which the remains of bearing trees mkd. by Germond and Frear:

A cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N. 46 1/2° E., 32 1/2 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A cedar, 27 ins. diam., bears S. 47° E., 24 lks. dist., with healed blaze.

A root hole, bears S. 63° W., 9 lks. dist., with a down cedar alongside, 25 ins. diam., with healed blaze.

A root hole, bears N. 36 1/2° W., 25 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 43 ins. diam., with healed blaze.

and a bearing tree mkd. by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963

A madrone, 39 ins. diam., bears N. 19° W., 77 lks. dist., with scribe marks T29S R4W S23 CS BT visible on partially healed blaze.

At the corner point

Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, directly over iron pipe, with brass cap mkd.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears S. 44° W., 147 1/2 lks. dist., mkd. T29S R4W S26 BT.

Land, mountainous.
Soil, rocky clay.

Timber, fir, oak, cedar, madrone, and maple; undergrowth, salal, fern, poison oak, vine maple, blackberry, and hazel.

From the cor. of secs. 24 and 25 only, on the E. bdy. of the Tp., monumented with an iron post, 1 in. diam., firmly set, projecting 6 ins. above ground, with brass cap mkd.
