	<p>Ascend 130 ft. over SW. slope.</p>
76.45	<p>Spur, slopes N. 30° W.; desc. 220 ft. over NW. slope.</p>
83.70	<p>Dirt road, 20 lks. wide, bears N. 75° E. and S. 75° W.</p>
86.50	<p>Creek, 5 lks. wide, course N. 65° W.; asc. 35 ft. over S. slope.</p>
87.82	<p>The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9, perpetuated and recorded by John H. Markham, Jr., Registered Engineer No. 2880, in 1957, monumented with an iron pipe, 2½ ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 18 ins. above ground, from which the remains of the original bearing trees:</p>

	<p>A root hole, bears S. 8¼° E., 25 lks. dist., with a down fir alongside, 25 ins. diam., with healed blaze.</p>

	<p>An alder, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 21° E., 46½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S9 visible on open upper blaze and healed lower blaze.</p>
	<p>A yew, 11 ins. diam., bears S. 3° W., 57 lks. dist., with scribe marks S9 visible on open upper blaze and healed lower blaze.</p>
	<p>A cedar, 22 ins. diam., bears S. 21½° W., 88½ lks. dist., with healed double blaze.</p>
	<p>A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N. 71° W., 34½ lks. dist., with scribe marks S5 visible on open upper blaze and healed lower blaze.</p>
	<p>and a bearing tree mkd. by James W. Byron, Deputy County Surveyor, in 1963</p>
	<p>A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 54° E., 41 lks. dist., with healed double blaze.</p>
	<p>At the corner point</p>
	<p>Set an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2½ ins. diam., 24 ins. in the ground, with brass cap mkd.</p>
